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Foreword

"Behold, I am Jesus Christ, the Son of God. I am the life and the light of the world. I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end." (Doctrine & Covenants 35:2)

This book is written in My voice, that you may hear Me speak directly to your soul. These words reveal My eternal work: the salvation and exaltation of mankind. I speak of where you came from, why you are here, and where you are going. I testify of My power to redeem and glorify the Earth, to conquer death and hell, and to gather Zion. My words are truth. He that hath ears to hear, let him hear.

Chapter 1: The Plan of Salvation—My Father's Eternal Work

From the foundation of the world, My Father and I prepared a plan—a plan of mercy, justice, agency, and love. You are not here by chance. You lived before you were born. You are children of the Most High God (Acts 17:28–29).

In the beginning, you dwelt in My Father's presence in the premortal world (Jeremiah 1:5; Abraham 3:22–23). There you learned, grew, and prepared for mortality. A choice was given: to follow Me or follow another. A third part chose rebellion and were cast down with Lucifer (Revelation 12:4, 9).

You chose faith. You accepted the plan. You received a body, entered mortality, and now walk by faith, not by sight. Earth life is your time to prepare to meet Me (Alma 34:32).

You are free to choose eternal life through Me, or captivity and death through the adversary (2 Nephi 2:27). My Atonement stands at the center of this plan. I suffered for your sins, your griefs, and your guilt (Isaiah 53:4–5; Alma 7:11–13). I broke the bands of death. Because of Me, you shall live again.

The plan includes ordinances—baptism, the gift of the Holy Ghost, priesthood covenants, temple endowments, and eternal marriage. These are not traditions—they are the laws of exaltation (Doctrine & Covenants 132:19–20).

My gospel is preached to the living and the dead. No one is forgotten. All shall hear My voice and make their choice.

Chapter 2: Death—The Portal of Resurrection

Fear not death. It is not the end—it is a beginning. At death, your spirit leaves your body and enters the world of spirits (Alma 40:11–14).

The righteous rest in paradise, awaiting the resurrection in peace. The unrepentant enter spirit prison, a place of reflection, where My servants still labor to preach My gospel (Doctrine & Covenants 138:29–34).

I broke the bands of death through My resurrection. I am the firstfruits of them that slept (1 Corinthians 15:20). Because I live, you shall live also.

You shall rise with an immortal body, perfect and eternal. Every limb, every wound, every tear shall be healed (Alma 11:43–44). The resurrection is universal; exaltation is conditional.

Chapter 3: Hell—Justice Without Mercy to the Unrepentant

Hell is real. It is not a place of flames alone, but of burning conscience and isolation from My presence (2 Nephi 9:16; Alma 12:14).

Those who die in rebellion enter spirit prison and suffer according to their sins, until they repent or are brought forth to judgment (Doctrine & Covenants 19:15–20). This temporary hell ends at the resurrection.

But there is also an **eternal hell**—outer darkness—for the sons of perdition. These are they who knew Me in fullness and yet denied Me and sought to destroy My work. They shall not be redeemed in time or eternity (Doctrine & Covenants 76:32–38).

I do not desire any soul to suffer. My arms are stretched out still. But I cannot force righteousness. Mercy cannot rob justice (Alma 42:25).

Chapter 4: Satan—The Tempter and the Accuser

Lucifer, once a son of the morning, fell through pride. He rebelled against My Father's plan and sought to destroy agency (Moses 4:1–4).

He is the father of lies, the tempter, and the accuser. His goal is to blind your mind, tempt your flesh, and bind your soul (2 Nephi 2:18, Revelation 12:10).

He has no body and no future. He seeks to make all men miserable like unto himself (2 Nephi 2:27). But he has no power over you unless you yield.

I overcame him. By My word and My blood, you also shall overcome (Revelation 12:11). Resist him. Cling to truth. Stay in the covenant path.

Chapter 5: Heaven—Degrees of Glory in My Father's House

There is a place for every soul who desires righteousness. My Father's house has many mansions (John 14:2). I have prepared them for you.

There are three kingdoms of glory:

- **Celestial Glory**: For those who receive Me, are baptized, receive the Holy Ghost, and keep their covenants. These are they who are exalted, become gods and goddesses, and dwell in eternal family units (Doctrine & Covenants 76:50–70; 132:19–20).
- **Terrestrial Glory**: For the honorable who rejected not the gospel entirely but did not receive the fullness in mortality. These shall be visited by Me, but not by My Father (Doctrine & Covenants 76:71–79).
- **Telestial Glory**: For those who were liars, sorcerers, adulterers, and unbelieving. After hell, they are redeemed and inherit a glory beyond mortal comprehension (Doctrine & Covenants 76:81–89).

Only the **sons of perdition** are cast into outer darkness.

Chapter 6: Zion—My Holy People Made One

Zion is My heart upon the earth. It is not only a place—it is a people, pure in heart (Doctrine & Covenants 97:21).

In the beginning, Enoch's city was caught up into heaven. In the end, it shall return and unite with Zion below (Moses 7:62–64).

Zion shall be built by the faithful, gathered from every nation. They shall be of one heart, one mind, and have no poor among them (Moses 7:18). The law of consecration shall govern the land. The Spirit shall dwell there. And I shall come and dwell among My people.

Chapter 7: The New Jerusalem—City of Light and Glory

The New Jerusalem shall be built on this land, a holy city prepared for My return. It shall be the center of Zion, the seat of My government on earth (Ether 13:3–10; Doctrine & Covenants 45:66–67).

Jerusalem of old shall also be rebuilt, and My people Israel shall return. Then shall I reign over both cities as King of kings, and the world shall know peace (Isaiah 2:2–4).
